Swamp White Oak (*Quercus bicolor*)

Origin: Seed-grown (normally), native to Michigan

Mature Size: Large (>45' tall)

Description: Swamp White Oak has a slow to moderate growth rate, and oval or pyramidal form in youth becoming rounded with age. It will occasionally have minor pest problems, but these do not usually affect the long-term health of the tree. Fall color varies from yellow to yellow/brown. Swamp white oak will produce acorns. Oaks in general can be somewhat difficult to transplant, and may require a higher level of maintenance (e.g. watering and pest control) in the first few years after planting. Swamp white oak tends to be more tolerant of poorly-drained soils than other oaks.
